



After serving in various positions in her Pompano Beach BPW, Nancy was elected **Florida State President of BPW/FL** in 1996. She followed her State presidency with an appointment as **BPW/FL's Public Policy Chair** and served in that capacity from 1998-2002 and again from 2004-2009. She led BPW members in their opposition to Governor Jeb Bush's One Florida plan disbanding affirmative action programs in state government; through the November 2000 elections; to their current focus on passing the ERA (Equal Rights Amendment) in Florida.

Ms. Hurlbert is a past **National President** (2004-2005) of **Business & Professional Women/USA** ([www.bpwusa.org](http://www.bpwusa.org)). During her tenure, she represented BPW/USA at both the 2004 **Democratic and Republican National Conventions**; at a convening of the **US Women's Chamber of Commerce**; a **White House Project** debriefing; as a **delegate to the UN during the U.S. Commission on the Status of Women's Beijing +10 Conference**; and, as a **panelist to the Democratic Women's Caucus Committee Hearing on Social Security**. Ms. Hurlbert is well-versed in work-life balance issues and legislation that affects women and families, and has extensive experience speaking at press conferences and national conferences. Prior to becoming BPW/USA President, Ms. Hurlbert was the **National Legislation Chair for BPW/USA** for three years.

In March 2004 Ms. Hurlbert concluded a 4-year term as **President of the Florida Women's Consortium (FWC)**, a statewide organization of more than 30 women's organizations throughout the state of Florida, representing some 250,000 members. Nancy has been **FWC's PAC Chair** for five years and was instrumental in FWC's PAC endorsement of Alex Sink in 2006 for Governor. She also concluded a 4-year term on **Florida Planned Parenthood's South Palm Beach and Broward Counties' Voice for Choice Action Fund and PAC** in December 2004. In 2006, Ms. Hurlbert was the **National Director of the U.S. Women's Chamber of Commerce's (USWCC) "Pipeline to the Presidency"**, during its inaugural election-year rollout.

From July 2003 to January 2005, Ms. Hurlbert was **Director of Site Engineering with Premier Commercial Realty**, the 4<sup>th</sup> largest real estate developer in South Florida. Prior to May 2003, she was a **vice president, partner and civil engineer with Williams, Hatfield & Stoner, Inc. (WHS)**, a consulting firm in South Florida with 6 offices and 75 employees. She had been with WHS for 30 years and handled marketing, public presentations for new projects and was responsible for design, permitting and construction of land development, public institutional and recreational projects. When joining WHS, Nancy was one of two women in the firm; upon her retirement, half of the employees were women, proving that a woman's voice *does* make a difference.

Ms. Hurlbert continues her political involvement in Lake County, FL where she is serving as the county chair of the Democratic Party since 2008-2012 and 2016 to present.
